

SWC RULES FOR FALL FAMILY CAMPING for Campers and Visitors

Massawepie Scout Camps, J. Warren Cutler Scout Reservation and Camp Babcock-Hovey 9/1/20

1. All campers must check in at the Camp Office. At check in, you will be asked to provide a list with the name and age of each person in your group, your vehicle description and also sign a waiver of liability claims. Temperatures and health screening questions of all guest will be taken and recorded and given to Ranger/Campmasters at check-in. Check out time is before noon on the last day. Please limit visitors. If a visitor must attend, they must go through health screening at office.
 - Social Distancing must be maintained between all groups. Groups should do everything they can to stay as a unit and not mingle with other units.
 - Masks must be worn when social distancing cannot be maintained. In low air flow conditions or close conditions, the social distancing recommendation goes from 6 feet to 14.
 - Children staying overnight must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
 - All CDC and NY Health Department guidelines will be followed and updated when available.
 - Group size will be limited to 50 people.
 - Occupancy of cabins, lodges, tent sites and RV sites shall be limited to the number of persons listed on the reservation sheet and the family camp permit. Occupancy is defined as using the facility for eating, sleeping or bathing. DOH regulations limit Maximum occupancy to 50% of building capacity.
 - Tents must be set up 10 feet apart with max 1 person per tent.
 - If renting a building, cots should be 10 feet apart or only use every other bunk.
 - Communal areas will be disinfected each day by Ranger / Campmaster staff. These areas include office, shower houses, latrines that are in use, etc.
 - Hand washing will be encouraged throughout Camp. Portable hand sanitizer stations will be moved to each building that is rented.
2. Pop-up campers, RV's, and tent camping shall be in areas designated by the Camp Ranger only.
3. **The Dining Hall is not permitted for use.**
4. All outdoor fires must be built in a "fire ring" (flames no higher than 24") or on a "fire alter". All fires must not be left unattended. Firewood may be gathered. No standing trees may be cut. If conditions warrant, the Ranger may prohibit outdoor fires altogether. No outside firewood is allowed on Camp property.
5. Pets, firearms of any kind, alcohol, all-terrain vehicles, and fireworks are not permitted on the camp property.
6. New York State mandated rules concerning the use of the waterfront are posted by the entrance to that area. All campers must abide by these rules to continue enjoying the waterfront area. Personal flotation devices (PFD's) must be worn at all times in canoes, rowboats and sailboats. This is a BSA policy and it will be enforced for your own safety. Safe Swim Defense and Safety afloat plans must be followed by all Scouts BSA groups. When you are finished with them, all canoes must be stowed upside down on a rack. Return the oars, paddles, PFD's to their proper storage areas. Secure sailboats and rowboats to the mooring lines. Please do your part to keep the area neat and clean. Waterfronts will be closed for season 9/30/20.
7. Parking Policy for each camp must be followed: If you are using an RV or tent site, one vehicle is allowed in the site, any additional vehicles must be parked in main parking lot. All additional vehicles must park in the main parking lot. No vehicles may drive over water lines. Do not block camp roads.
8. All Seneca Waterways Camps are "carry in carry out" facilities. Please take garbage home.
9. The Seneca Waterways Council, BSA is pleased to make these facilities available for your enjoyment. We ask your help in keeping them in good condition. The cost of damaged camp property or destruction of grounds will be charged to the renter based on repairs needed. We ask that your conduct and behavior reflect the high standards of the Boy Scouts of America.
10. Covid, Bathing beach and all Council policies must be followed.
