

2020 Seneca Waterways Council Fall Family Camping Plan and Policy's For Campmasters and Staff

Please know that the safety of our youth members, volunteers, and employees is our top priority. We will do what we can to make Camp safe and enjoyable.

- Social Distancing must be maintained between all groups. Groups should do everything they can to stay as a unit and not mingle with other units.
- Masks must be worn when social distancing cannot be maintained
- Children staying overnight must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- All CDC and NY Health Department guidelines will be followed and updated when available.
- Group size will be limited to 50 people. Occupancy of cabins, lodges, tent sites and RV sites shall be limited to the number of persons listed on the reservation sheet and the family camp permit. Occupancy is defined as using the facility for eating, sleeping or bathing. DOH regulations limit Maximum occupancy to 50% of building capacity.
- All campers must have temperature taken on arrival and each camper fills out health screening questionnaire. Ranger / Campmaster will oversee process and collect filled out questionnaires.
 - Process will be;
 - Unit arrives
 - Unit Leader / parent or guardian is given thermometer takes his own temp and records. Then he /she takes temps for all campers and ensures all health screening forms are filled out properly and returned to Ranger / Campmaster
 - Only unit leader is allowed in check-in location. All other campers are to wait outside or in vehicles.
 - After thermometer is returned to Ranger / Campmaster it is wiped down and sanitized.
 - At check-in 2020 rules and policies are gone over with unit leader. It is our job to inform and educate not necessarily count heads.
 - Friday night meeting. If large number of units, consider holding outside or do individually at check-in. Possible locations are Caraface pavilion or Eagle porch.
- Please limit visitors. If a visitor must attend, they must go through health screening at the check-in office.
- Tents must be set up 10 feet apart with 1 person per tent.
- If renting a building, cots should be 10 feet apart or only use every other bunk.
- Communal areas will be disinfected each day by Ranger staff. These areas include office, shower houses, and latrines that are in use, etc.
- Hand washing will be encouraged throughout Camp. Portable hand sanitizer stations will be moved to each building that is rented.

Campmaster Procedures

- Langie and Annex should only sleep 33% of occupancy
- If more space is needed for overnight accommodations unrented buildings can be used.
 - Cutler Cohen North
 - Hovey Memorial or Eagle
 - Or any other building that is not rented
- Communal facilities such as kitchens and bathrooms should be sprayed down daily with disinfectant. A pump sprayer with disinfectant will be provided at each Campmaster location. Ranger will go over proper use with each Campmaster crew upon arrival.
- Dining of group should be spread out allowing 6 foot spacing if possible.
- Dining Halls will be not in service
- All SWC Fall camping policies should be followed. Lead by example
- Any Campmaster that feels uncomfortable should stay home

Program Material Sanitizing:

Any program material loaned out / used must be sanitized upon return. No sharing of equipment between users. All areas should be limited to 50% occupancy. At all times 6' spacing should be maintained. Example; Archery shooters should at every other shooting station.

Example: Archery

- Unit xyz uses archery range. Each camper is given a bow and arrows and they are not shared and used through session.
- After session is done all bows arrows and any other equipment is laid out on picnic table and sprayed down with disinfectant and allowed to air dry
- Minimum 30 minutes between groups to allow for sanitizing and air drying
- Archery Ranger instructor / Ranger will oversee sanitization

Example: Compasses

- Unit xyz uses compasses. Each camper is given a compass and they are not shared and used through session.
- After session is done all compasses and any other equipment is laid out on picnic table and sprayed down with disinfectant and allowed to air dry or wiped down with disinfectant wipes.
- Minimum 30 minutes between groups to allow for sanitizing and air drying
- Campmaster / Ranger will oversee sanitization

Other program materials loaned out must be sanitized upon return to Campmaster in a similar way as examples. At this point rifle, air gun or shotgun ranges will be offline for Fall of 2020 or until proper sanitizing procedures can be developed.
